



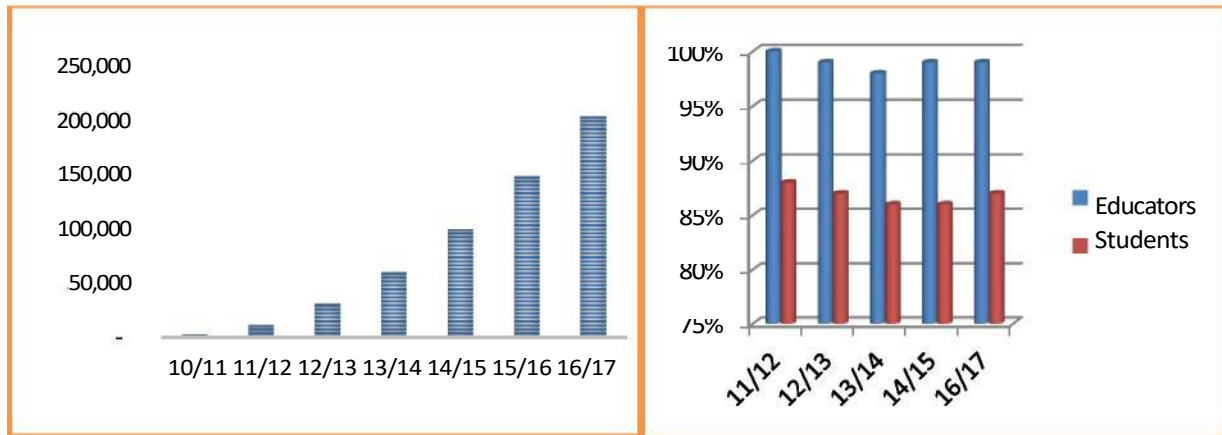

[Students & Leaders Network](#) (SLN) is a startup 501(c)3 nonprofit that began in September 2010 and serves as a bridge to identify and involve Wisconsin experts and leaders with the Wisconsin educational system by providing live, interactive web conferencing and digitally stored [video](#) discussions (stored on SLN web site and streamed by educators to their classes) on topics that provide information and insight on careers and life challenges for students, educators and parents. **The program is free to schools.**

Students participating in SNL program from inception through the 2016/2017 school year. **Since start, 203,818 WI students participated in live sessions and streaming SLN videos to classes. 55,053 Wisconsin students participated in 2016/17 school year.**
